Councilmember Marqueece Harris-Dawson,

I write to you today as a person who spent two years homeless in Los Angeles, before finally finding stability with the help of local shelters and the city Housing Authority's section 8 program.

My journey into homelessness began, as it does for many women and children, with domestic violence. I had a whirlwind romance that turned toxic as soon as I upended my life and moved to California. I started planning to take my first child and leave, but found myself pregnant, despite being on birth control. A violent fight ended in a miscarriage, a rape, and another pregnancy. I tried several times to leave during this pregnancy, but financial abuse and coercion kept me around.

By the time our son was born, I was ready to go. I'd convinced my abuser that if we broke up, he could move back in with his mother, and I could move into a small apartment nearby. He could come see our son when he was "in a good place" and go home when he was not. I tried to make it work.

Instead, as I began my housing search, he picked a nonsensical fight and abducted our son. Turns out that he'd been making plans of his own. I was served with custody paperwork the day

after the abduction, dated months prior.

Court hearings, mediation, attorneys... We settled on a custody schedule that gave him near-daily access to our infant, and it allowed me three months to find another place to live—because I found out, in all of this, that he'd lied about adding my name to the lease.

He violated our court stipulation almost immediately, and I suddenly went from 90 days, a pending job offer, and time for DPSS to step in with childcare assistance... to 30 days, with childcare estimated to take longer, and a job I couldn't start without said childcare.

I called on every bit of white privilege I enjoy: an aunt with a real estate license and property management company in Virginia flew in to help me find an apartment. No one would take her as a co-signer, being from out of state. They claimed that they couldn't verify her information. The few apartments that were willing to take a co-signer balked when I showed up with two small children. "Kids are loud," they said. "This is a quiet community."

I called 211, DPSS, domestic violence hotlines—anyone who I thought could give me a housing referral. I just needed something temporary until I could get on my feet, right?

Homeless services providers lamented that they could not help until I was ACTUALLY homeless. Impending homelessness wasn't enough. Moving assistance from the county couldn't help until I started working, and I couldn't start working without childcare, and I couldn't lock myself into a childcare agency until I knew where I was going to be living for the next six months—and I knew I was going to be homeless within 30 days.

If you've read this far, thank you for caring.

As I said at the beginning, I did end up homeless. From May 15, 2017 until July 3, 2017, I had nowhere to go. DPSS provided me with money for a motel—first, for seven days, then seven more, then two; a total of 16 days—each allotment requiring a visit to the welfare office. I got a small tax return that I put towards more motels. I tried to sell plasma, which would have covered one night's stay, but was turned away at the door when I showed up with one of my kids.

It was during this chaotic time that I tried to find an AirBnB. Why not? Some of their listings were the same price as motels where I was suffering harassment, filth, and extra fees—and these places looked NICE! Unfortunately, I did not qualify to stay at any AirBnB properties. I didn't have the additional deposits. I was rejected for having kids. Or I was turned away for lack of a permanent address.

It took weeks of searching and pleading phone calls to finally find a domestic violence shelter. They promised me 30 days, and were able to extend that to 60 days, because my ex assaulted me after a court hearing. When I timed out of that shelter, I went to Skid Row for several months, before I finally ended up at a family shelter in Koreatown, the Alexandria House. They helped me apply for the section 8 program—which is how I came to live in your district.

Again, if you are reading this: thank you for caring.

I am telling you my story today to urge you to go against your gut instinct and reject this motion. I know that you are one of the two who have put this bill forth. Please reconsider. I am surprised to see Herb Wesson on here considering all the support he has provided to Alexandria House and to underprivileged kids via the Camp Wesson program. It was with transportation provided by Herb Wesson's office that I was able to reach an event that gave me my first haircut in several years.

I say again: please reconsider. I know that it FEELS like allowing people to rent out an extra house will shrink the wealth gap—and in the short term, for a small segment of the population, it might! But in the long term, it will literally leave families on the street. Landlords and property management companies enjoy such power in the Los Angeles housing market that they bend for no one.

I am begging you to reconsider your position on this matter.
