TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE REPORT relative to the feasibility of implementing the recommendations from the February 2019 Canoga Park and Reseda Parking Utilization Studies.

Recommendation for Council action, pursuant to Motion (Blumenfield – Bonin):

INSTRUCT the Los Angeles Department of Transportation (LADOT) to report on the feasibility of implementing the recommendations from the February 2019 Canoga Park and Reseda Parking Utilization Studies; including the most beneficial, economical and highest priority strategies for the City to implement as fast as possible to address impacts to on-street parking during construction and operation of the Reseda Boulevard Street Improvements Project.

<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

SUMMARY

On February 22, 2019, Council considered Motion (Blumenfield – Bonin) relative to the feasibility of implementing the recommendations from the February 2019 Canoga Park and Reseda Parking Utilization Studies.

Motion states LADOT retained Nelson Nygaard to conduct a comprehensive parking study in the core commercial districts of Canoga Park and Reseda along Sherman Way. It was determined that, with proper management of City-controlled parking, there is adequate parking supply in both areas to accommodate projects that may reduce the supply of public parking, including the Reseda Boulevard Street Improvement Project; and to accommodate demand from projects that are expected to increase parking demand without including on-site parking, such as the Reseda Theater and Madrid Theater projects. The parking studies offer several recommendations to improve the management of publicly-owned parking assets in Canoga Park and Reseda. Motion movers believe that these recommendations deserve further study and analysis by LADOT, and funding for implementation if necessary. Motion recommends that Council instruct LADOT to report on the feasibility of implementing the recommendations of the studies. Council referred Motion to the Transportation Committee for consideration.

At its meeting held August 28, 2019, the Transportation Committee recommended that Council approve Motion's recommendation.
