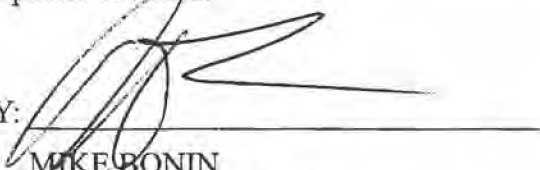


MOTION

Verizon relies on a series of strategically placed radio base stations to provide continuous signal quality to its customers, including residents and businesses, throughout the City of Los Angeles. The Hyperion Water Treatment Plant (Plant), a LA Sanitation (LASAN) facility, offers an optimal location for siting a telecommunications facility. Verizon is proposing to construct several antennas and equipment cabinets on a rooftop of one of the Plant's buildings, at the same location where AT&T has installed a telecommunications facility.

Verizon proposes to construct, operate, and maintain a wireless cell site for the transmission and reception of radio communications signals. The Verizon radio signals are low-powered, high-frequency waves licensed and authorized by the Federal Communications Commission. Following a limited construction period of between 30 and 45 days, Verizon expects to only be on-site to conduct routine maintenance visits, typically once a month. No activities are expected to produce odor, vibration, heat, glare, or noxious and toxic materials. Council District 11 residents will not be affected by the Verizon telecommunications facility.

I THEREFORE MOVE that the City Council instruct the Department of General Services (GSD), with the assistance of the City Attorney and any other relevant departments, to negotiate a lease agreement, or other appropriate agreement, with Verizon Wireless for space at the Hyperion Water Treatment Plant, located at 12000 Vista Del Mar, Playa Del Rey, 90293 in Council District 11, to install rooftop antennas and equipment cabinets.
