A Neighborhood Council Community Impact Statement (CIS) has been successfully submitted to your Commission or City Council. We provided information below about CISs and attached a copy of the CIS.

We encourage you to reach out to the Community Impact Statement Filer to acknowledge receipt and if this Community Impact Statement will be scheduled at a future meeting. Neighborhood Council board members are volunteers and it would be helpful if they received confirmation that you received their CIS.

The CIS process was enabled by the Los Angeles Administrative Code §Section 22.819. It provides that, "a Neighborhood Council may take a formal position on a matter by way of a Community Impact Statement (CIS) or written resolution." NCs representatives also testify before City Boards and Commissions on the item related to their CIS. If the Neighborhood Council chooses to do so, the Neighborhood Council representative must provide the Commission with a copy of the CIS or resolution sufficiently in advance for review, possible inclusion on the agenda, and posting on the Commission's website. Any information you can provide related to your agenda setting schedule is helpful to share with the NC.

If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *listed on the Commission's agenda*, during the time the matter is heard, the designated Neighborhood Council representative should be given an opportunity to present the Neighborhood Council's formal position. We encourage becoming familiar with the City Council's rules on the subject. At the Chair's discretion, the Neighborhood Council representative may be asked to have a seat at the table (or equivalent for a virtual meeting) typically reserved for City staff and may provide the Neighborhood Council representative more time than allotted to members of the general public. They are also permitted up to five (5) minutes of time to address the legislative body. If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *not listed on the agenda*, the designated Neighborhood Council representative may speak during General Public Comments.

Summary: The DRNC strongly supports CF 19-1020, which seeks to establish a Commission on Lived Experience with Homelessness (CLEH), composed entirely of individuals who are currently or have recently experienced homelessness in Los Angeles. The DRNC urges the Los Angeles City Council and Housing and Homelessness Committee to take immediate action to extend and reintroduce CF 19-1020, which expired on November 18, 2024. The CLEH is a vital initiative that ensures people with lived experience of homelessness play a direct role in shaping the systems intended to serve them. It is essential that the City recognize unhoused residents as critical stakeholders, whose input can drive more

effective, compassionate, and lasting solutions to the homelessness crisis. The failure to move forward on this initiative undermines efforts to build inclusive and equitable housing policies. The DRNC requests the following actions: - Extend and reintroduce CF 19-1020 to ensure the full establishment of the CLEH. - Compel the reports previously requested by the Homelessness and Poverty Committee, specifically: - A report from the City Administrative Officer identifying budget and staffing requirements, as well as a source of funding for CLEH. - A report exploring potential collaboration between CLEH and existing city commissions, the Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority (LAHSA), and related agencies. - Provide a detailed update on the status of the CLEH ordinance and the remaining steps needed for full implementation, with a timeline for deliverables. The Del Rey Neighborhood Council stands with Rampart Village, Reseda, Sherman Oaks, and other Neighborhood Councils in calling for urgent action to revive this initiative. The unhoused community deserves a legitimate, functioning Commission that reflects their voices and addresses their needs. We request that this matter be brought to the Housing and Homelessness Committee and full City Council without delay.
