Honorable members of the Los Angeles City Council:

Empowerment Congress West Area Neighborhood Development Council (ECWA) supports council motion 20-0002-S101, which opposes California State Senate Bill 1120. This bill will encourage the redevelopment of the low density and transit adjacent areas of Crenshaw. ECWA seeks to preserve the character of our duplex and single-family home neighborhoods and concentrate new growth along our uninvested commercial corridors. We lack affordable, subsidized, housing, yet this bill is a purely market-rate solution. We see this bill as a catalyst to further gentrification as many residents currently facing displacement pressure will not be able to benefit from this trickle-down housing approach. Furthermore, facing uncertainty regarding the future viability of transit, we are concerned about the parking requirement preemption in SB 1120. Finally, we are opposed to the state's attempt to wrest land use control from the Crenshaw Community and shift to a top-down, one size fits all statewide approach.
