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## Goal:

Create a cohesive framework to organize City's response to crisis, informed by community partners, to identify opportunities to scale up



- Comprehensive Homeless Strategy
  - A Bridge Home
  - Project RoomKey
  - Project HomeKey
  - Rent Stabilization
  - Eviction Defense
  - Emergency Rental Assistance
  - LAHSA Contracts - Re-Housing and Outreach \$325 million / year
  - Supportive and Affordable Housing Production
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# Four Components of Action Plan

## Prevention

- Prevent households from becoming homeless.
- 215,000 renter households at risk of eviction due to high rent burden.

## Immediate Shelter & Interim Housing

- Provide appropriate interim housing, including recuperative care, mental health and substance use treatment beds, for 28,852 unsheltered people.

## Permanent Affordable & Supportive Housing

- Produce 185,000 new affordable units – including supportive housing, board and care homes – over eight years.

## Street Engagement

- Connect with 28,852 unsheltered individuals in the City, some living in 170 priority encampments.

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# Investment Plan

- Assess available funding
- Gaps analysis
- 5 year plan to meet targets
- Engage partners for capital, operating and services funding



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# Progressive Action Plan


- Investment and Production Goals: prevention, shelter, permanent housing, street engagement
