Goal:

Create a cohesive framework to organize City's response to crisis, informed by community partners, to identify opportunities to scale up



- Comprehensive Homeless Strategy
 - A Bridge Home
 - Project RoomKey
 - Project HomeKey
 - Rent Stabilization
 - Eviction Defense
 - Emergency Rental Assistance
 - LAHSA Contracts – Re-Housing and Outreach \$325 million / year
 - Supportive and Affordable Housing Production

Four Components of Action Plan

Prevention

- Prevent households from becoming homeless.
- 215,000 renter households at risk of eviction due to high rent burden.

Immediate Shelter & Interim Housing

- Provide appropriate interim housing, including recuperative care, mental health and substance use treatment beds, for 28,852 unsheltered people.

Permanent Affordable & Supportive Housing

- Produce 185,000 new affordable units – including supportive housing, board and care homes – over eight years.

Street Engagement

- Connect with 28,852 unsheltered individuals in the City, some living in 170 priority encampments.

Framework & Action Plan

- Investment and Production Goals: prevention, shelter, permanent housing, street engagement
- How to scale up most effective programs to meet five year goals?
- Engage stakeholders in advocacy, provider, business, people with lived experience of homelessness, and academic communities.
