

M O T I O N

At the end of the summer in 2019, the property owner at 1170 W. 38th Street in Council District 8 paid the Department of Water and Power (DWP) for residential water service installation prior to the City sending the 30-day notice of scheduled resurfacing. After the property owner paid for the water installation, DWP went to the site to mark the location where the new water meter would be installed which would require DWP to cut into the adjacent street.

After several weeks, the Bureau of Street Services resurfaced this section of 38th Street on September 18, 2019 prior to DWP installing the meter. An exception to the City's one-year street cut moratorium is therefore necessary to allow for DWP to cut into the street and install water services at this location as the resident has already paid for the installation.

I THEREFORE MOVE that the City Council approve an exception to the City's one-year street cut moratorium on 38th Street to allow for the installation of water service for the property located at 1170 W. 38th Street.

I FURTHER MOVE that the permittee be required to properly repair and resurface the street cut area in accordance with Bureau of Engineering requirements and standards and, upon completion of the work, the repaired street cut be inspected by the Bureau of Contract Administration to maximize the longevity of the street.
