Like the many Angelenos who have called in and tweeted their opposition, I am urging the City Council to block the Mayor's horrific and white supremacist budget.

The LAPD is one of the most abusive and corrupt law enforcement departments in the country, and the city is repeatedly sued over the LAPD's abuse of power. We are in the midst of a global health pandemic — thousands remain unhoused and millions are at risk of joining those ranks. 

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



Dear Holly Wolcott,

My name is Princess Leus, and I have been a resident of Los Angeles for 16 years. I love this city and am proud to call myself an Angeleno. The Mayor's response to COVID-19 has been encouraging, and I am glad to see that actions are being taken to ensure the safety of our city's residents.

I am writing to you today because I recently read that the proposed 2020-2021 budget allocates over \$3 billion to the LAPD.<sup>1</sup> In light of the recent (and ongoing, for decades) police brutality committed in the United States at large, here in Los Angeles, and because of the murders of George Floyd, Breonna Taylor, Tony McDade, and countless more innocent black people at the hands of police officers, I feel compelled to write and ask you - as I am sure many have - to allocate funds away from the LAPD's budget and invest in education and ending the homelessness crisis here in Los Angeles.

There are many important issues facing our citizens, and an increased police presence only serves to increase the number of African Americans (and people of color) who will experience extreme, potentially life-ending instances of police brutality in the future. Additionally, there is evidence that a movement away from aggressive police presence leads to a decrease in crime. In 2017, when "New York police officers temporarily reduced their "proactive policing" efforts on low-level offenses, major-crime reports in the city actually fell, according to a study based on New York Police Department crime statistics." <sup>2</sup>

I am a concerned citizen who is angrier than ever at systemic injustice, the school to prison pipeline, and the plethora of ways in which our country is designed to place roadblocks in the way of people of color, specifically African Americans. One such obstacle is the disproportionate amount of violence that black and brown people face at the hands of police officers, both in this city and country.

I would respectfully ask Mayor Garcetti to invest in education and relieving homelessness rather than continuing to overfund the police force.

Dear Paul Krekorian,

**You need to adopt a People's Budget and defund the police. Looking at the thousands of Los Angeles County residents who came out to peacefully protest the systemic violence against Black people and support reallocating funds away from the police, you can not turn a blind eye to the numbers.**

We are in the midst of a health pandemic with severe economic consequences. Over 50% of Angelenos are unemployed — and we can expect 42% lasting unemployment. Over 50% of this city is renters — and if folx are unemployed, they cannot pay rent. Prior to the pandemic, there were around 60k unhoused folx; after evictions and economic insecurity due to COVID-19 and its fall out, we can expect thousands more. We, as a city, are just beginning to see the economic fall out from this public health crisis, which disproportionately will affect Black and Brown people, livelihoods and businesses.

In this context, the Mayor is proposing an increase to LAPD, despite the fact that crime has fallen considerably during the past few months. LAPD has seen a rise in overtime which, more often than not, is paid out to officers harassing unhoused folx, and Black, Indigenous, people of color.

After declining to vote on this draconian proposal last week, City Council referred it back to the Budget and Finance Committee. Now, the Committee has decided not to meet, thereby shirking its duty and upholding the racist and white-supremacist structures that underlie both the proposal and City Council as a governing body.

I am calling on you, Paul Krekorian, to schedule a Budget and Finance Committee emergency meeting and strike down the mayors budget proposal, and instead work with People's Budget which centers Care, not Cops. **You need to Adopt a People's Budget which defunds the police.** Public opinion is with me, especially after the visibility from the protests this weekend.





Dear Elected Officials,

These are the changes I demand based on guidelines by the NAACP:

1. A ban on the use of chokeholds and knee holds.
2. The Use of Force Continuum for any police department to ensure there are at least 6 steps with clear rules on escalation.
3. State Open Records Act must ensure officer misconduct information and disciplinary histories are not shielded from the public. Recertification credentials may be denied for police officers if determined that their use of deadly force was unwarranted by federal guidelines.
4. Implementation of Citizen's Review Boards in municipalities to hold police departments accountable and build public confidence.

These are the changes I demand as a member of the community:

1. Defund police and allocate money into health care and public health departments. In particular, support preventative physical and mental health initiatives.
2. Fund projects and departments who devote their lives to improving quality of life: promoting education that promotes multiculturalism, fixing infrastructure, planting native plants, offering green spaces, and activities for children to play and communities to exercise.
3. Fund emergency preparedness against disease and natural disasters.
4. Create comprehensive policies that thoroughly investigate claims of police brutality in a timely manner. Make it a priority to condemn and reprimand officers who abuse their power. Make immediate arrests against officers who brutalize and/or kill unarmed peoples.

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Most of you are parents. If your child was yelling, crying, throwing a tantrum, and throwing things at you would you smack them in the head? Would you threaten them? Would you retaliate? I sure hope not. Hitting back and threatening will only add to their trauma.

You would love them. Listen to them. Hug them. You would tell your child that everything would be okay and you love them no

matter what.

When you decided to become a politician you devoted yourself to be a parental figure for your community. These are your children you are attacking.

Assume the responsibility as a parent.

Do not abuse your children. Treat them with love. Even when they lash out at you, it is your responsibility to take it. It is your responsibility to see that your child is hurting. It should break your heart. They are hurting so bad they do not know what to do. Assume the leadership and show them the way. Learn how you have contributed to their pain. Instead of running away—denying the fact you hurt your child—and taking out your insecurities on them, make a change within yourself.

Whether I voted for you or not, you must represent all of us. Not just one party or another.
