Dear Councilmember Busciano.

My name is Michael Jacobs. I am calling on you to support the defunding of the Los Angeles Police Air Support Division. This political moment demands that the Los Angeles City Council look for areas where harmful law enforcement programs can be cut from the budget for the upcoming fiscal year. By withdrawing financial support for the LAPASD, the City Council can retire a politically dated program that actively harms LA residents and drains resources that could be better spent elsewhere. These funds should be redirected towards social programs to keep Angelenos safe, housed and healthy in a time of desperate need.

The LAPASD is a notoriously unpopular, abusive, and costly arm of the city's law enforcement apparatus. As the past several weeks of protests against police brutality and public outcry over LA's budget have made abundantly clear, the people of Los Angeles are demanding divestment from city and county programs that harm Black, Latinx, and unhoused communities.

By 2020 estimates, it costs \$1,200 per hour to fly an LAPD helicopter—without accounting for the pilot's salary. On average, an LAPD helicopter burns the equivalent of two car tanks of gas per hour. The constant thunder of LAPD/LASAD helicopters overhead, day and night, make Angelenos feel like we live in a war zone, where our own city's division of public safety is the invading army. There is nary a morning where I'm not woken up by the rumble of a helicopter.

The LAPASD unit cannot be justified as a crime-solving expense. In past studies, these helicopters have successfully resolved a mere six percent of car theft cases. LAPD responds to these damning statistics by arguing that the helicopters are part of a 'predictive policing' campaign to stop crime before it happens. 'Predictive policing' is essentially a euphemism for racial profiling, an issue that has long plagued the LAPD. In 2015, the ACLU of Southern California found that Black Angelenos are three times more likely to be stopped by police than white Angelenos under the program. Given the helicopters' ubiquity over neighborhoods whose residents are overwhelmingly low-income Black and/or Latinx people, it is clear that LAPD finds its air division to be an expedient way to surveil the city's non-white communities.

If you find it difficult to imagine LA without the constant presence of these helicopters, consider this: No other major US city possesses a comparable amount of helicopters. If the five US cities with population levels closest to Los Angeles (New York, Chicago, Houston, Phoenix and Philadelphia) combined their fleets, they'd still have ten fewer helicopters than Los Angeles.

It is abundantly clear that the psychological and material costs of the LAPASD are far greater than its contribution to public safety. At the end of the day, the continued use of these helicopters takes away funding that could be used to benefit LA's most marginalized residents. We echo the calls of Black Lives Matter LA and other community organizations: Divest from the LAPD and invest these

resources back into the community.

Please contribute to the betterment of public safety and social justice in our city by defunding the Los Angeles Police Air Support Division. Better yet, defund the entire police department - your constituents want that, as evidenced by the presentation led by Black Lives Matter LA earlier this week.

Dear Councilmember Busciano,

My name is Michael Jacobs. I am calling on you to support the defunding of the Los Angeles Police Air Support Division. This political moment demands that the Los Angeles City Council look for areas where harmful law enforcement programs can be cut from the budget for the upcoming fiscal year. By withdrawing financial support for the LAPASD, the City Council can retire a politically dated program that actively harms LA residents and drains resources that could be better spent elsewhere. These funds should be redirected towards social programs to keep Angelenos safe, housed and healthy in a time of desperate need.

The LAPASD is a notoriously unpopular, abusive, and costly arm of the city's law enforcement apparatus. As the past several weeks of protests against police brutality and public outcry over LA's budget have made abundantly clear, the people of Los Angeles are demanding divestment from city and county programs that harm Black, Latinx, and unhoused communities.

By 2020 estimates, it costs \$1,200 per hour to fly an LAPD helicopter—without accounting for the pilot's salary. On average, an LAPD helicopter burns the equivalent of two car tanks of gas per hour. The constant thunder of LAPD/LASAD helicopters overhead, day and night, make Angelenos feel like we live in a war zone, where our own city's division of public safety is the invading army. There is nary a morning where I'm not woken up by the rumble of a helicopter.

The LAPASD unit cannot be justified as a crime-solving expense. In past studies, these helicopters have successfully resolved a mere six percent of car theft cases. LAPD responds to these damning statistics by arguing that the helicopters are part of a 'predictive policing' campaign to stop crime before it happens. 'Predictive policing' is essentially a euphemism for racial profiling, an issue that has long plagued the LAPD. In 2015, the ACLU of Southern California found that Black Angelenos are three times more likely to be stopped by police than white Angelenos under the program. Given the helicopters' ubiquity over neighborhoods whose residents are overwhelmingly low-income Black and/or Latinx people, it is clear that LAPD finds its air division to be an expedient way to surveil the city's non-white communities.

If you find it difficult to imagine LA without the constant presence of these helicopters, consider this: No other major US city possesses a comparable amount of helicopters. If the five US cities with population levels closest to Los Angeles (New York, Chicago, Houston,

Phoenix and Philadelphia) combined their fleets, they'd still have ten fewer helicopters than Los Angeles.

It is abundantly clear that the psychological and material costs of the LAPASD are far greater than its contribution to public safety. At the end of the day, the continued use of these helicopters takes away funding that could be used to benefit LA's most marginalized residents. We echo the calls of Black Lives Matter LA and other community organizations: Divest from the LAPD and invest these resources back into the community.

Please contribute to the betterment of public safety and social justice in our city by defunding the Los Angeles Police Air Support Division. Better yet, defund the entire police department - your constituents want that, as evidenced by the presentation led by Black Lives Matter LA earlier this week.
