There was an incident on Bessemer Street in Van Nuys/Valley Glen tonight.

About 10-15 police officers arrived around 8 pm. Not a single officer was wearing a mask.

One of the officers tased a calm, unarmed black man without speaking to him first, without asking a single question or giving any directive. He had been sitting on the sidewalk for maybe 30 minutes before the police arrived. I happened to be in my front yard and I saw the whole thing.

According to the officers there, there was a question about whether or not this man had stolen a cell phone. I overheard this discussed by police after they had already tased the man and he was lying motionless on the ground.

The police could not find the alleged cell phone. They searched the man's clothes after they tased him, they searched the sidewalk and the yards around the block. They could not find anything incriminating on or around the man.

Tasing the man left him nearly unconscious. LAPD called in the LAFD. The LAFD arrived on the scene shortly thereafter. Every LAFD officer was wearing a mask. With the help of the LAFD, the man, still dazed, was strapped to a wheelchair and rolled into the street directly facing the police squad car search lights.

What I saw tonight made me sick. I saw a man preemptively attacked by police. This man was minding his own business. He was sitting on the public sidewalk. He had been sitting there, quietly and peacefully.

Does sitting on the sidewalk warrant being tased? Does sitting on the sidewalk warrant being subjected to physical pain and public humiliation?

In the middle of a global pandemic, this man, who had done nothing to warrant this abuse, had ten officers in his face, and not a single one was wearing a face mask or gloves.

This is reckless behavior on top of gross abuse of power.

After what I witnessed tonight, I'd like to know what happened to this man. I'd like to know if he survived the encounter. I'd like to know if he was charged, and if so, if he received the right to proper legal counsel. I'd like to know if he'll be paying for those paramedics that were called in response to him being attacked.
