My name is Rose and I live in North Hollywood. I'm writing to ask that the Mayor's Office and the Los Angeles City Council consider the People's Budget LA for the 2020-2021 fiscal year and revise the current budget accordingly.

Unlike the Mayor's budget, which allocates more than half of the city's general funds to the LAPD, the People's Budget LA allocates only 5.7% to the police. Survey takers in LA determined that the city should prioritize universal needs (such as housing, childcare, healthy food, clear air and water), pandemic recovery, built environment, and reimagined public safety over the current police department. I am asking the Mayor's Office and the City Council to engage directly with communities, especially members of Black and Indigenous communities — those most at risk of police brutality and murder — to create a budget that serves ALL Angelenos.

Over the past several weeks, our city has shown its support for reimagining what community safety and policing should look like. It has made clear — through both physical and digital actions— that LA must not use over 50% of its general funds to support the LAPD.

Throughout this time of protest, the police have reacted with extreme violence and unwarranted escalation toward peaceful protestors and our unhoused neighbors. This is unacceptable, and it has motivated me to think about - and to now ask my elected officials for - a shift in what we want the job of a police officer to be in our city. The People's Budget will allow us to move away from ultimately futile conversations about how a police officer should act and toward productive, community-focused conversations about what the job should be.
