Subject: **INTERIM HOUSING BEDS AND PERMANENT SUPPORTIVE HOUSING UNITS
OPEN WITHIN THE CITY OF LOS ANGELES AS OF FEBRUARY 19, 2025**

SUMMARY

On October 6, 2022, the Office of the City Administrative Officer (CAO) provided the first report on all interim housing solutions open within the City, as of December 31, 2021 (C.F. 20-0841). The CAO recommended annually reporting back on all interim housing (IH) beds and permanent supportive housing (PSH) units within the City. This is the third annual report on all open IH solutions and the second annual report on all open PSH solutions in the City, including City-funded and non-City-funded beds and units.

RECOMMENDATION

That the City Council, subject to the approval of the Mayor:

1. Note and file this Report.

BACKGROUND

On March 9, 2022, the Council and Mayor approved the City Administrative Officer (CAO) report dated January 24, 2022 (C.F. 20-0841), as amended, to instruct the CAO to report on all interim housing (IH) solutions within the City. On October 27, 2022, the Homelessness and Poverty Committee amended the CAO report dated October 6, 2022, to instruct the CAO to report on all interim housing beds and permanent supportive housing (PSH) units within the City, including an analysis of the increase or decrease in beds or units. On May 14, 2024, the CAO released its second annual report on all open interim housing solutions and the first annual report on all PSH solutions within the City as of December 31, 2023 (C.F. 20-0841).

In coordination with the Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority, the CAO submits this report on all IH beds and PSH units within the City, as of February 19, 2025.

DISCUSSION

This report utilizes interim housing (IH) and permanent supportive housing (PSH) data provided by the Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority (LAHSA), based on the 2025 Housing Inventory Count (HIC). Additional information regarding site details included in this report can be found on LAHSA’s dedicated HIC webpage.

The timeline of this report was impacted by the delay of the 2025 HIC results. Moving forward, LAHSA has communicated its expectation to provide future HIC reports in the summer of each year. These reports cover all IH and PSH sites within the City, including both City-funded and non-City-funded beds and units.

LAHSA also indicated that future updates to the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) will enable the agency to provide data pertaining to the demographics of the populations served, as well as the number of beds and units that are City-funded and non-City-funded. This information will be included in future reports.

Interim Housing Inventory

As of February 19, 2025, LAHSA reports 17,207 IH beds were open within the City, including City-funded and non-City funded beds. This represents an increase of 2,314 beds in the City’s IH inventory since December 31, 2023, as detailed in the previous report. Table 1 below shows the total IH beds as of February 19, 2025, and the change in beds since December 31, 2023.

Permanent Supportive Housing Inventory

As of February 19, 2025, LAHSA reports 22,648 PSH units were open within the City, including City and non-City funded units. Note that this count is based on units that are participating in LAHSA’s Coordinated Entry System (CES). This represents an increase of 5,446 PSH units since December 31, 2023. Table 2 below shows the total PSH units as of February 19, 2025, and the change in units since December 31, 2023.
