Due process should be applied to all cases. The ENC is not opposed to trainings, it is opposed to the overreach this gives to the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment (DONE). We oppose the ability or the authority of DONE to suspend, remove, or exclude from quorum any board member who is otherwise entitled to participate with Neighborhood Council activities.
