

PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE REPORT relative to proposed adjustments to the Board of Police Commissioners (BPC) Service Fees for Fiscal Year (FY) 2020-21.

Recommendation for Council action:

REQUEST the City Attorney to prepare and present the appropriate Ordinances to effectuate the proposed adjustments to the BPC Service Fees for FY 2020-21 as recommended in the April 30, 2020 BPC report, attached to the Council file.

Fiscal Impact Statement: The City Administrative Officer (CAO) reports that approval of the proposed adjustments to the Police Commission Service Fees as recommended in the October 6, 2020 CAO report, attached to the Council file, are estimated to generate approximately \$1.27 million in net cost recovery for the services provided.

Financial Policies Statement: The CAO reports that the recommendation in the October 6, 2020 CAO report is in compliance with the City's Financial Policies in that the proposed fees are deemed fair and recover the full cost of the services provided.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

Summary:

On October 13, 2020, your Committee considered an October 6, 2020 CAO report relative to proposed adjustments to the Board of Police Commissioners (BPC) Service Fees for FY 2020-21. The April 30, 2020 BPC report is attached to the CAO report and is incorporated therein. According to the CAO, in accordance with Los Angeles Municipal Code Sections 21.22, 41.40, 52.16, and 103.206(e), the BPC is responsible for issuing Press Passes, Noise Variances, charitable organization Information Cards, and assessing False Alarm Fees within the City. Each of these services has an associated fee intended to recover the actual costs to the City for administering the service and enforcing related programs. It should be noted that a recent legal matter known as *Linderman et al. v. City of Los Angeles* (Council File No. 19-0386) concerns litigation associated with the Board's Alarm System Subscriber Initial Permit Fee. This fee is distinct from the Board's False Alarm Service Fee and is therefore not impacted by this legal matter. On April 29, 2020, Council adopted Ordinance No. 186611 amending the Board's Alarm System Subscriber Initial Permit Fee to comply with the settlement terms (Council File No. 20-0301). A summary of the proposed fee changes is included in the CAO report and the CAO concurs with the BPC. After consideration and having provided an opportunity for public comment, the Committee moved to recommend approval of the proposed fee increases, which will require Ordinances to effectuate. This matter is now submitted to Council for its consideration.
