Enforce the rules and laws while the politicians and experts discuss the best way to proceed. People, by no fault of their own in many cases, will need to rely on friends and family, not on residents who have had no part in their desperate situation. Drug use, vandalism, trash and crime have skyrocketed in Los Angeles. Why would you want to introduce that into residential neighborhoods? We've seen what that does to the main roads, bridges and underpasses. Please, let's find a solution, but let's not temporarily "hide" the problem by shuffling the issue into peaceful and clean neighborhoods. Once you raise taxes, it's almost impossible to lower them again, and once you allow a human crisis like this to spread into suburban neighborhoods, it will be almost impossible to enforce transplanting them again. Los Angeles has a history of just shuffling it's problems from one area to another, such as with moving homeless downtown, or dropping them off at hospitals. Let's not contribute to their proven process of creating migrant camps moving from area to area in order to obfuscate the situation. It's been a decades long strategy that has not solved the underlying problem of high housing costs, limited rental and home buying options and letting real estate barons run the city, which puts the burden on legal homeowners who scraped and saved to create a safe environment for their families.
