The CIS process was enabled by the to Los Angeles Administrative Code §Section 22.819. It provides that, "a Neighborhood Council may take a formal position on a matter by way of a Community Impact Statement (CIS) or written resolution." NCs representatives also testify before City Boards and Commissions on the item related to their CIS. If the Neighborhood Council chooses to do so, the Neighborhood Council representative must provide the Commission with a copy of the CIS or rResolution sufficiently in advance for review, possible inclusion on the agenda, and posting on the Commission's website. Any information you can provide related to your agenda setting schedule is helpful to share with the NC.

If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *listed on the Commission's agenda*, during the time the matter is heard, the designated Neighborhood Council representative should be given an opportunity to present the Neighborhood Council's formal position. We encourage becoming familiar with the City Council's rules on the subject. At the Chair's discretion, the Neighborhood Council representative may be asked to have a seat at the table (or equivalent for a virtual meeting) typically reserved for City staff and may provide the Neighborhood Council representative more time than allotted to members of the general public. They are also permitted up to five (5) minutes of time to address the legislative body. If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *not listed on the agenda*, the designated Neighborhood Council representative may speak during General Public Comments.

Summary: Dear Councilmembers: The Arleta Neighborhood Council supports Council File 20-1376-S5 and thanks Councilwoman Traci Park and Councilwoman Imelda Padilla for moving forward with this amendment to Los Angeles Municipal Code 41.18. However, it is subsection (d) that is the obstacle to orderliness and a breach of security to families, children, enjoyment of property, businesses and commerce, threatens the elderly and people with disabilities, and endangers the general public as encampments always require a City Council resolution prior to removal. Observe, (d) No person shall be found to be in violation of any prohibition set forth in Subsection (c), unless and until: (i) the City Council has taken action, by resolution, to designate a specified area or areas for enforcement against sitting, lying, sleeping, or

storing, using, maintaining, or placing personal property, or otherwise obstructing the public right-of-way; (ii) the City has posted signage at the designated area or areas set forth in the resolution, with such signage including reference to any required findings adopted in the resolution, and giving notice of the date after which no sitting, lying, sleeping, or storing, using, maintaining, or placing personal property, or otherwise obstructing the public right-of-way will be allowed; and (iii) at least 14 calendar days have passed from the date on which the signage is posted at the designated area or areas. The Arleta Neighborhood Council recommends that the motion be amended to also include the removal of subsection (d), shown above, as well so as to leave no room for misapplication/misinterpretation or non-enforcement of the amendments that purport to protect the public from scofflaws that endanger all members of the public and threaten both public and private properties' integrity in addition to compromising the public's health and the cleanliness of sidewalks, alleys, streets, and all areas used as informal places of shelter and refuge.

The Arleta Neighborhood Council recommends that the motion be amended to also include the removal of subsection (d), shown above, as well so as to leave no room for misapplication/misinterpretation or non-enforcement of the amendments that purport to protect the public from scofflaws that endanger all members of the public and threaten both public and private properties' integrity in addition to compromising the public's health and the cleanliness of sidewalks, alleys, streets, and all areas used as informal places of shelter and refuge where urine, fecal material, hepatitis/disease residuals, alcohol beverage containers, narcotics and needles and other related paraphernalia are found, among other illicit materials, in both public and private right-of-ways. Protect LA.
