Comments for Public Posting: Please see attached PDF, a sample of the CA Veterinary Medical Board's "Rodeo Reporting Forms." Per CA Penal Code 596.7, animal injuries and fatalities are required to be reported to the state VMB within 48 hours of the conclusion of rodeo. People often ask what the injury & death rates are in rodeo animals, and the answer is that WE WILL NEVER KNOW! Despite this "window dressing" penal code, there are still: * LOOPHOLES (i.e. practice sessions are exempt); also * UNDER-REPORTING; and * ZERO ENFORCEMENT when state law is broken. Therefore it is up to individual municipalities to write their own legislation to protect these animals. Rodeos are already banned in several cities in California. LOS ANGELES NEEDS TO BE NEXT!

RODEO REPORTING FORM

In accordance with section 4830.8 of the Business and Professions Code, attending or on-call veterinarians at a rodeo event are required to report to the Veterinary Medical Board any animal injury at the event requiring veterinary treatment within 48 hours of the conclusion of the rodeo.

In addition to the reporting requirements for veterinary treatment at the rodeo event, veterinarians rendering treatment to an animal for an injury that the veterinarian knows occurred at a rodeo event must report to the Veterinary Medical Board within seven (7) days of rendering the treatment.

This form is provided to assist veterinarians in making such mandatory reports; all information in the report is required by section 4830.8.

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
**Veterinarian's Report for the Poway Rodeo (Sept. 23 & 24, 2022)
in compliance with California Penal Code 596.7 (2)**

As the attending veterinarian for the above event, the following is a brief case description of the animal injuries/issues that I observed/treated:

1. A steer (ear tag # [REDACTED]) sprained it's left front leg during the 9/23/22 evening Steer Wrestling competition. The patient was isolated near his herd mates. The steer appeared to improve slightly by the following day. The patient will continue to be observed and will transported back to Arizona.
2. A rodeo queen's horse developed minor colic prior to the 9/24/22 evening performance. The trainer administered [REDACTED]. I administered [REDACTED] and administered [REDACTED] via [REDACTED]. The patient made a full recovery in a short amount of time.
3. During the 9/24/22 afternoon performance, I met with Officers S. Koehler and T. Verenicin-Chan of the Escondido Humane Society as they were inspecting the animals. They expressed concern regarding a competitor's horse that was tied near the back entrance as it did not have water, and a down steer in his pen that stood immediately when stimulated and exhibited no abnormal behaviors.
