

They are too small and their content is undesirable to feedstock buyers. We have the opportunity to reduce unnecessary resource extraction for unwanted items (that usually sit in a drawer or are immediately tossed). The City also has a responsibility to reduce potential waste from the overall stream (before it is even in the stream) as a means to abide by their environmental goals and also increase their waste diversion potential. If the item is not in the stream to begin with then your overall diversion potential is higher. These items also make their way into our physical environmental and especially our waterways. We spend a tremendous amount of money, time, and labor cleaning up intentional and unintentional littered blight. Let's reduce that potential. This is a simple, low hanging fruit that will reduce our impact, lead us toward our city goals, empty our utensil drawer at home, and show Los Angeles as the environmental leader in this space.
