That the Mayor and City Council AUTHORIZE the Controller to appropriate \$190,000 to the Police Department Trust Fund No. 885/70S809, Department No. 70 for South Park Community Safety Partnership program, and therefore, REIMBURSE to Fund No. 100, Department No. 70, account numbers and amounts as follows:

Account No. 001012, Salaries Sworn, \$60,000
 Account No. 001092, Overtime Sworn, \$130,000

DISCUSSION

This donation will continue funding for the Community Safety Partnership (CSP) program in the South Park Area for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 to cover programming and the salary upgrades and overtime costs for one Sergeant II, five Police Officer III+1s, and five Police Officer IIIs. This donation will also fund the purchase of various community engagement items and provide academic scholarships to several students living within the CSP Neighborhood Engagement Areas.

The Community Safety Partnership Bureau (CSPB) is guided by the following five components: Public Safety, Community Engagement, Wrap-Around Programming, Safe Passages, and

Enhanced Community Capacity. The CSP officers host meetings in which participating community stakeholders act as equal partners in evaluating and creating responses to crime trends and quality of life issues. The officers also collaborate with existing community-based organizations, individual schools, philanthropic groups, and gang interventionists via the Mayor's Office of Gang Reduction and Youth Development (GRYD) to offer a variety of programs designed to reach every member of the community, from youth to seniors. Through the "Wrap-Around Programming" component, CSPB connects community members with educational and enrichment opportunities.

Approval of this donation benefits the Department by increasing public trust through the practice of relationship-based policing and helping further develop and maintain relationships with community members and community organizations. In addition, providing college-aged students with academic scholarships will enhance their ability to thrive in their post-secondary education.

Funding for the CSP site in South Park will pay for the salary upgrades for one Sergeant II, five Police Officer III+1's and five Police Officer III's. The funding would also cover overtime cost and community engagement expenses.

CSP officers collaborate with stakeholders to host meetings where participants act as equal partners in evaluating and creating responses to crime trends and quality of life issues. The officers also participate in less formal community events and celebrations. Other important aspects of community engagement include job readiness programs for adults, resident volunteer programs and even traditional footbeats, which allow officers to have direct interaction and engage community members in conversation that leads to relationship building.

CSP officers collaborate with existing community-based organizations, individual schools, philanthropic groups, and gang interventionists via the Mayor's Office of Gang Reduction and Youth Development (GRYD) to offer a variety of programs designed to reach every member of the community, from youth to seniors.

In addition, funding will provide scholarships to several students living within CSP Neighborhood Engagement Areas. Providing college-aged students with scholarships will enhance their ability to not only attend but thrive in their post-secondary education.
