INFORMATION, TECHNOLOGY, AND GENERAL SERVICES and HOMELESSNESS AND POVERTY COMMITTEE REPORT relative to identifying City-owned properties not suitable for permanent or interim housing that can be utilized to create a City-wide network of shipping-container storage facilities for people experiencing homelessness in the City.

Recommendation for Council action, pursuant to Motion (Raman - Harris-Dawson):

DIRECT the City Administrative Officer (CAO) to identify City-owned parking lots, vacant parcels, and other properties not suitable for permanent or interim housing that can be utilized to create a distributed, City-wide network of small-scale, shipping-container storage facilities for people experiencing homelessness in Los Angeles, and to report within 60 days with a plan for the funding and establishment of an initial five such facilities in key locations throughout the City where there is a great unmet need among homeless residents for storage solutions.

<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: Neither the CAO nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

<u>SUMMARY</u>

At the meeting held on August 5, 2021, your Information, Technology, and General Services Committee considered a Motion (Raman - Harris-Dawson) relative to identifying City-owned properties not suitable for permanent or interim housing that can be utilized to create a City-wide network of shipping-container storage facilities for people experiencing homelessness in the City.

After an opportunity for public comment was provided, the Information, Technology, and General Services Committee moved to approve the recommendation contained in the Motion, as detailed above.

Subsequently, on August 26, 2021, the Homelessness and Poverty Committee also considered this matter and after providing an opportunity for public comment, the Homelessness and Poverty Committee concurred with the recommendation made previously by the Information, Technology, and General Services Committee.

This matter is now forwarded to the Council for its consideration.
