If not, we would be glad to show them the site and the entire neighborhood so that they can see firsthand what a huge impact the proposed hotel would have (i.e., fire, environmental, commercialization of 100% residential; quality of life).
- 7) Has the fact that the proposed Bulgari Hotel is in a Very High Fire Severity Zone been considered in the Committee's review of the proposal to change the zoning, or of Motion CF21 -0777?
- 8) Has the Committee considered matters involving the environmental integrity of the Benedict Canyon neighborhood, and if so, what were those considerations?
- 9) Has the rescheduled date for the Motion been set, and if so, when? If not, what is the reason that it has not yet been set?
