Neighborhood Council board members are volunteers and it would be helpful if they received confirmation that you received their CIS.

The CIS process was enabled by the Los Angeles Administrative Code §Section 22.819. It provides that, "a Neighborhood Council may take a formal position on a matter by way of a Community Impact Statement (CIS) or written resolution." NCs representatives also testify before City Boards and Commissions on the item related to their CIS. If the Neighborhood Council chooses to do so, the Neighborhood Council representative must provide the Commission with a copy of the CIS or resolution sufficiently in advance for review, possible inclusion on the agenda, and posting on the Commission's website. Any information you can provide related to your agenda setting schedule is helpful to share with the NC.

If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *listed on the Commission's agenda*, during the time the matter is heard, the designated Neighborhood Council representative should be given an opportunity to present the Neighborhood Council's formal position. We encourage becoming familiar with the City Council's rules on the subject. At the Chair's discretion, the Neighborhood Council representative may be asked to have a seat at the table (or equivalent for a virtual meeting) typically reserved for City staff and may provide the Neighborhood Council representative more time than allotted to members of the general public. They are also permitted up to five (5) minutes of time to address the legislative body. If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *not listed on the agenda*, the designated Neighborhood Council representative may speak during General Public Comments.

We support the framework of the Livable Communities Initiative (LCI), Program #131 in Los Angeles' Housing Element, as a way to create high-quality, lower cost homes and home ownership opportunities in walkable 15-minute communities near transit that do not have on-site parking. We support creating safe mobility for vulnerable road users and residents who cannot drive or choose not to drive as a way to create equitable access to transportation for all, as well as to address California's goals for air quality, climate emissions and VMT (vehicle miles traveled) reduction. ([Deck](#) and [plan](#)).

We ask for LCI to work with us on where we want housing and what we want it to look like in order to create consensus on how to address our housing shortage, as well as our traffic, climate, air quality and mobility crises. We support the framework of single-staircase reform to facilitate Courtyard Buildings with ample air and light. Additionally, we support the creation of Standard Plans, streamlined, off-the-shelf architectural plans which are chosen by the community, and are an option for property owners and builders, promoting efficient infill projects without the need for lot assembly and extensive entitlement processes. We specifically support studying Gayley Ave (between Weyburn and Kinross) and Westwood Blvd for the possible implementation of LCI within the boundaries of our Neighborhood Council.

We also express support for the Larchmont 2030 Plan laid out by LCI.
