Summary: ● AB 1594, The Firearm Industry Responsibility Act, would allow individuals and the CA AG to sue firearm manufacturers and retailers for injury and death caused by non-compliance with regulations or unfair business practices. ○ Under this act, members of the firearm industry will be expected to adhere to a standard of conduct, and to apply that standard of conduct to their downstream distributors. The standard of conduct asks firearm industry members to not manufacture, market, import, offer for wholesale sale, or offer for retail sale a firearm-related product that is abnormally dangerous. Firearm products are considered “abnormally dangerous” if they are designed or marketed: ■ for assaultive purposes rather than lawful gun use ■ to be converted into illegal firearms ■ to minors or other individuals who are legally prohibited from accessing firearms ○ This act also allows Californians who are harmed by a firearm industry member’s violations of law to bring legal action against firearm manufacturers and retailers. ● AB 1621, on unserialized firearms (i.e. “ghost guns”), would extend the definition of a firearm to include firearm precursor parts. ○ Existing law requires that people manufacturing a firearm or assembling a firearm from unserialized components apply for a unique mark from the Department of Justice. This bill would require those people to do that by January 1, 2024. ○ Adoption of this bill would explicitly prohibit the possession or transfer of a firearm without a serial number or mark of identification after January 1, 2024. ○ This bill would regulate gun kits and "80 percent retrievers" as fully functional firearms. ● AB 2571, would restrict the marketing or advertising of certain weapons, such as semi-automatic weapons or higher caliber firearms, to children. ○ The bill would impose a civil penalty of up to \$25,000 for each violation, and would authorize a person harmed by a violation to bring suit to recover any damages suffered.
