SUBJECT: Resolution to SUPPORT AB 2897 (O'Donnell) and SB 1122 (Allen).

<u>CLA RECOMMENDATION</u>: Adopt the Resolution (Buscaino – Bonin) to include in the City's 2021-2022 State Legislative Program, SUPPORT for AB 2897 (O'Donnell) and SB 1122 (Allen) which seek to expand the territory of the San Gabriel and Lower Los Angeles Rivers and Mountains Conservancy by including the Dominguez Channel watershed, the coastal watersheds of Manhattan Beach to the Palos Verdes Peninsula, and Santa Catalina Island and to update the San Gabriel and Lower Los Angeles Parkway and Open Space Plan in order to preserve their unique open space and wildlife habitat.

SUMMARY

The Resolution (Buscaino – Bonin), introduced May 17, 2022, advises that existing law establishes the San Gabriel and Lower Los Angeles Rivers and Mountains Conservancy (Conservancy) in the Natural Resources Agency and prescribes the functions and duties of the Conservancy with regard to the protection, preservation and enhancement of specified areas of the Counties of Los Angeles and Orange located along the San Gabriel River and the lower Los Angeles River and tributaries along those rivers. The Resolution notes that there are two bills pending in the State legislature pertaining to the Conservancy that are similar in nature: AB 2897 (O'Donnell) and SB 1122 (Allen). These bills seek to expand the territory of the Conservancy by including the Dominguez Channel watershed, the coastal watersheds of Manhattan Beach to the Palos Verdes Peninsula, and Santa Catalina Island. The Resolution further notes that SB 1122 (Allen) would also direct the Conservancy to update the San Gabriel and Lower Los Angeles Parkway and Open Space Plan to include the priorities for conservation and enhanced public use within the expanded territory of the Conservancy. The Resolution states that by including these areas within the Conservancy's jurisdiction, the State is ensuring that their unique open space and wildlife habitat and conservation efforts will be preserved and enhanced for the surrounding communities and generations to come.

Therefore, the Resolution requests that the City include in its 2021-22 State Legislative program support for AB 2897 (O'Donnell) and SB 1122 (Allen) which seek to expand the territory of the San Gabriel and Lower Los Angeles Rivers and Mountains Conservancy and to update the San Gabriel and Lower Los Angeles Parkway and Open Space Plan as specified in order to preserve their unique open space and wildlife habitat.

BACKGROUND

Both AB 2897 (O'Donnell) and SB 1122 (Allen) use identical language with the intent of expanding the San Gabriel and Lower Los Angeles Rivers and Mountains Conservancy in the Natural Resources Agency to include the Dominguez Channel watershed, the coastal watersheds of Manhattan Beach to the Palos Verdes Peninsula, and Santa Catalina Island. Currently, the Conservancy includes specified areas of the Counties of Los Angeles and Orange located along the San Gabriel River and the lower Los Angeles River, and the tributaries along those rivers. The expansion would allow the Conservancy to support projects and provide grants to wilderness conservation efforts thereby benefitting the surrounding communities.

SB 1122 (Allen) would also require the conservancy to update the San Gabriel and Lower Los Angeles Parkway and Open Space Plan to include the priorities for conservation and enhanced public use within the Dominguez Channel watershed, the coastal watersheds of Manhattan Beach to the Palos Verdes Peninsula, and Santa Catalina Island.

The San Gabriel and Lower Los Angeles Parkway and Open Space Plan currently includes policies and priorities for the conservation of the San Gabriel River and its watershed, the Lower Los Angeles River, and the San Gabriel Mountains, and identifies underused existing public open spaces and includes recommendations for providing better public use and enjoyment.

AB 2897

AB 2897 (O'Donnell) is currently inactive as it failed to move from the Assembly's Committee process by April 29, 2022, pursuant to Joint Senate and Assembly Rule 61(b)(5). The Rule specifies the last day for policy committees to hear and report fiscal bills to a fiscal committee introduced in their house. The Rule may be suspended by a 2/3 vote of the Assembly. This bill is currently referred to the Assembly's Natural Resources Committee. SB 1122 (Allen) remains active with identical language.

RESOLUTION RULES, ELECTIONS & INTERGOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS

WHEREAS, any official position of the City of Los Angeles with respect to legislation, rules, regulations or policies proposed to or pending before a local, state or federal governmental body or agency must have first been adopted in the form of a Resolution by the City Council with the concurrence of the Mayor; and

WHEREAS, AB 2897 and SB 1122 seek to expand the territory of the Conservancy by including the Dominguez Channel watershed, the coastal watersheds of Manhattan Beach to the Palos Verdes Peninsula, and Santa Catalina Island; and

WHEREAS, SB 1122 would also direct the Conservancy to update the San Gabriel and Lower Los Angeles Parkway and Open Space Plan to include the priorities for conservation and enhanced public use within the Dominguez Channel watershed, coastal watersheds of Manhattan Beach to the Palos Verdes Peninsula, and Santa Catalina Island; and

WHEREAS, by including these areas within the Conservancy's jurisdiction, the State is ensuring that their unique open space and wildlife habitat and conservation efforts will be preserved and enhanced for the surrounding communities and generations to come;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, with the concurrence of the Mayor, that by the adoption of this Resolution, the City of Los Angeles hereby includes in its 2021-2022 State Legislative Program SUPPORT for AB 2897 (O'Donnell) and SB 1122 (Allen) which seek to expand the territory of the San Gabriel and Lower Los Angeles Rivers and Mountains Conservancy by including the Dominguez Channel watershed, the coastal watersheds of Manhattan Beach to the Palos Verdes Peninsula, and Santa Catalina Island and to update the San Gabriel and Lower Los Angeles Parkway and Open Space Plan in order to preserve their unique open space and wildlife habitat.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 2897, as introduced, O'Donnell. San Gabriel and Lower Los Angeles Rivers and Mountains Conservancy: territory: Dominguez Channel watershed and Santa Catalina Island.

Existing law establishes the San Gabriel and Lower Los Angeles Rivers and Mountains Conservancy in the Natural Resources Agency and prescribes the functions and duties of the conservancy with regard to the protection, preservation, and enhancement of specified areas of the Counties of Los Angeles and Orange located along the San Gabriel River and the lower Los Angeles River and tributaries along those rivers. Existing law, for purposes of those provisions, defines "territory" to mean the territory of the conservancy that consists of those portions of the Counties of Los Angeles and Orange located within the San Gabriel River and its tributaries, the lower Los Angeles River and its tributaries, and the San Gabriel Mountains, as described.

This bill would additionally include the Dominguez Channel watershed and Santa Catalina Island, as described, within that definition of territory, and would make various related changes to the boundaries of that territory.

SECTION 1. Section 32601 of the Public Resources Code is amended to read:

- (b) To preserve the San Gabriel River and the Lower Los Angeles-River River, the Dominguez Channel watershed, and Santa Catalina Island consistent with existing and adopted river and flood control projects for the protection of life and property.
- (c) To acquire open-space lands within the territory of the conservancy.
- (d) To provide for the public's enjoyment and enhancement of recreational and educational experiences on public lands in the San Gabriel Watershed and Lower lower Los Angeles River, and the San Gabriel-Mountains Mountains, the Dominguez Channel watershed, and Santa Catalina Island in a manner consistent with the protection of lands and resources in those watersheds.

- 38 (c) Approve conservancy funded projects that advance the policies and priorities set forth in Section 32602.

(d) Prepare a San Gabriel and Lower Los Angeles Parkway and Open Space Plan to be approved by a majority of the cities representing a majority of the population, the Board of Supervisors of Los Angeles County, the Central Basin Water Association, and the San Gabriel Valley Water Association. The plan shall include, but not be limited to, all of the following elements:

- (1) A determination of the policies and priorities for the conservation of the San Gabriel River and its watershed, the Lower lower Los Angeles River, and the San Gabriel Mountains, in accordance with the purposes of the conservancy as set forth in Section 32602.
- (2) A plan for incorporating, as relevant, the principles and planning work contained within the Los Angeles River Master Plan prepared by the County of Los Angeles.
- (3) An identification of underused existing public open spaces and recommendations for providing better public use and enjoyment in areas identified in the plan.
- (4) An identification of, and a priority program for implementing, those additional low-impact recreational and open space needs, including additional or upgraded facilities and parks that may be necessary or desirable.
- (e) Update the San Gabriel and Lower Los Angeles Parkway and Open Space Plan to include the priorities for conservation and enhanced public use within the Dominguez Channel watershed, coastal watersheds of Manhattan Beach to the Palos Verdes Peninsula, and Santa Catalina Island.

SECTION 1. Section 31102 of the Public Resources Code is amended to read:

31102. The Secretary of the Natural Resources Agency shall select one of the public members to serve as the chair of the conservancy. The public member shall serve as chair at the pleasure of the secretary. The members of the conservancy may select a vice chair by majority vote. A majority of the total authorized membership of the conservancy shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business under this division. The conservancy shall adopt its own regulations.
