Our community has two major dumping locations: Big Tujunga Canyon (entry to the Angeles National Forest) and La Tuna Canyon Rd. Our Sunland-Tujunga Forward team notified our CD7 representative and the MRCA about both illegal dumping locations which on weekly basis include construction debris, hazardous material and (yes) dead bodies. At the request of Sunland-Tujunga Forward the MRCA installed cameras on their properties where heavy dumping activity is continuously occurring; these temporary cameras have been stolen since there is no permanent structure to mount them onto. We hope that this motion will provide permanent surveillance cameras along these very heavily dumping locations in Sunland-Tujunga and La Tuna Canyon to apprehend those who are illegally dumping.
