Summary: The DRNC supports CF 22-0151 (Raman/Koretz/O'Farrell/Martinez/Harrison-Dawson) which calls for a plan to be developed within 180 days for an ordinance and/or regulatory framework effective January 1, 2023, that will require all new residential and commercial buildings in LA to achieve zero carbon emissions. In recent years the City has made progress towards decarbonizing its electric grid, phasing out urban oil drilling, and investing in EV charging infrastructure, but we have lagged behind other California cities in tackling our largest source of emissions: buildings. Direct and indirect emissions from buildings account for 43% of the City's carbon emissions, compared to 25% statewide and 30% nationwide. Currently 45 California cities and counties have already enacted building decarbonization ordinances. It is time for LA to take bold action to decarbonize its buildings.
