Summary: CF 22-0158 Los Angeles Municipal Code / 12.03 / 12.80 / 12.81 / Shelters for the Homeless / Interim Housing / Zones. [Sunland-Tujunga Neighborhood Council's CIGA Committee recommends AGAINST] Sunland-Tujunga Neighborhood Council is OPPOSED to CF 22-0158 for the following reasons: 1). There are faster existing options available to be considered or utilized, such as 26 city-owned vacant lots and parking lots identified in the City Controller's report of Jan. 2022. 2) Emergency housing, without long-term plans to resolve drug addiction, job skills and permanent housing, extends the problem without any real solution. 3). Per LAMC 12.81, temporary homeless shelters are already permitted by-right in the R3, RAS3, R4, RAS4, C2, C4, C5, M1, M2, M3 zones. Permitting homeless shelters "by-right" in all other more-restrictive zones, like single family zones, is inconsistent with the current review process (i.e. Conditional Use) that other uses have to file for. It is wrong to speed up and shut out community input, concerns, and/or support on potentially controversial projects. 4). The placement system is not based on the local homeless population. It goes well beyond that with no limitations or end in sight.
