

HOMELESSNESS AND POVERTY and HOUSING COMMITTEES REPORT relative to preparing a local preference policy for affordable housing units and subsidized housing units that utilize the Coordinated Entry System (CES) for tenant selection and lease up; and the feasibility of preparing a local preference policy for interim housing beds receiving City Funding.

Recommendations for Council action, pursuant to Motion (De León - Blumenfield - Harris-Dawson):

1. REQUEST the Los Angeles Housing Department (LAHD) to work with the applicable Federal and State agencies to prepare a local preference policy for subsidized affordable housing units and supportive housing units that do not utilize the CES for tenant selection and lease up, and report within 60 days.
2. REQUEST the LAHD to work with the Housing Authority of the City of Los Angeles and the Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority (LAHSA) to prepare a local preference policy for affordable housing units and subsidized housing units that utilize the CES for tenant selection and lease up, and report within 90 days.
3. REQUEST the LAHD to work in coordination with LAHSA to report on the feasibility of preparing a local preference policy for interim housing beds receiving City Funding, and report within 90 days.

Fiscal Impact Statement: Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

### SUMMARY

At the meeting held on August 11, 2022, your Homelessness and Poverty Committee considered a Motion (De León - Blumenfield - Harris-Dawson) relative to preparing a local preference policy for affordable housing units and subsidized housing units that utilize the CES for tenant selection and lease up; and the feasibility of preparing a local preference policy for interim housing beds receiving City Funding.

After an opportunity for public comment was held, the Committee moved to approve the recommendations contained in the Motion, as detailed above.

Subsequently, on August 24, 2022, the Housing Committee also considered this matter and after providing an opportunity for public comment, the Housing Committee concurred with the recommendations made previously by the Homelessness and Poverty Committee.

This matter is now forwarded to the Council for its consideration.
