Subject: A Bridge Home Fund Allocation and Usage

Honorable Members:

During the City Council's consideration of the Mayor's proposed budget for the Fiscal Year (FY) 2022/2023, the City Council requested the Los Angeles Police Department (Department) to report on the use of A Bridge Home (ABH) funds. On September 7, 2022, the Department submitted its report to the City Council, Council File No. 22-1042. The Department's report was discussed at multiple meetings of both the Public Safety and the Budget, Finance, and Innovation Committees

On March 15, 2023, the Budget, Finance, and Innovation Committee heard the Department's prior report on Council File No. 22-1042 and asked for additional information on the utilization of ABH funds. On April 10, 2023, the Budget, Finance, and Innovation Committee forwarded the matter to City Council for consideration.

In response to the March 15, 2023 request, the Department hereby presents the following updated and additional information for the City Council's consideration:

- An update on the allocation of remaining funds;
- An update on utilization of funds; and,
- An update on the measure of effectiveness.

DISCUSSION

Allocation of ABH Funds Across All Council Districts for the FY 2022/2023:

The Department recognizes all 27 ABH shelters designated by the Office of the Mayor as delineated by the following (see Table 1):

For the remaining FY 2022/2023 ABH funds, each Council District will be allocated a base amount of 1,952 hours (see Table 2). An additional 500 hours per shelter will be allocated to each Council District based on the ABH shelter locations. This was the same distribution method used when the funds were initially allocated. The Base Allotted Hours have decreased from the Department's initial report because the average cost for officers increased to \$93.50, and because the initial report was for a total of eight million dollars. The following table was based on the allocation of the remaining four million dollars.

Similarly, the ABH Allotted Hours decreased from 1,000 hours per ABH site to 500 hours per ABH site because the initial report was based on eight million dollars, and this report is based on four million dollars.

Utilization of Funds Update:

The Department has allotted 43,478 overtime hours based on the initial four million dollars in ABH funds. The current allotted hours of 43,478 differs from the allotted hours on Table 2 because the average cost for an officer on overtime has changed to \$93.50. From July 1, 2022, through February 28, 2023, the Department has used 37,764.9 overtime hours (approximately \$3,437,990.81), resulting in 5,713.1 overtime hours remaining. (see Table 3).

Measure of Effectiveness:

The Department conducted an analysis of crimes involving persons experiencing homelessness (PEH). The following table depicts homeless-related Part I crimes, identifying instances where the victim or the suspect was homeless. Part I crimes included Homicide, Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Burglary, Grand Theft Auto, Burglary from Motor Vehicle, and Theft. The data compared crimes involving PEH throughout the City (FY 2021/2022 versus FY 2022/2023). Although there was an increased number of crimes involving PEH in some geographic Areas, there was an overall decrease in crimes involving PEH after the implementation of ABH overtime (See Table 4). This demonstrates that the continued use of the ABH overtime fund will further the Department's goal of reducing Part 1 crimes among our vulnerable PEH communities.
