

PUBLIC SAFETY and BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEES' REPORT relative to the Fiscal Year 2022 Body-Worn Camera (BWC) Policy and Implementation Grant Program – Digital Evidence Management and Integration Demonstration Project 12-month no-cost extension.

Recommendation for Council action, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE MAYOR:

1. AUTHORIZE the Chief of Police, Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD), or designee to:
 - a. Accept the United States Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance Program's approval of a no-cost extension for the Fiscal Year (FY) 2022 Body-Worn Camera Policy and Implementation Program to Support Law Enforcement Agencies Grant – Digital Evidence Management and Integration Demonstration Project (FY 2022 BWC Digital Evidence), extending the award period from October 1, 2022 through September 30, 2025, to October 1, 2022 through September 30, 2026.
 - b. Negotiate and execute a new contract or amend existing agreements between the City of Los Angeles and Axon Enterprises, Inc. for centralization and integration of all digital evidence, not to exceed \$250,000 for the performance period of October 2022 to September 30, 2026, subject to the review of the City Attorney as to form.
2. AUTHORIZE the LAPD to prepare Controller's instructions for any technical adjustments, subject to the approval of the City Administrative Officer, and authorize the Controller to implement the instructions.

Fiscal Impact Statement: The CAO reports that approval of the recommendations within this report will have no additional impact to the General Fund and will allow for the continued expenditure of the FY 2022 Body-Worn Camera Policy and Implementation Grant Program to Support Law Enforcement Agencies – Digital Evidence Management and Integration Demonstration Project grant award totaling \$1,000,000 from the United States Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs. No matching funds are required for this grant.

Financial Policies Statement: The CAO reports that the recommendations in this report are in compliance with the City's Financial Policies in that, to the extent possible, all grant funds will be utilized for grant-eligible activities.

SUMMARY

At its regular meeting held on August 20, 2025, the Public Safety Committee considered a City Administrative Officer report and Board of Police Commissioners report relative to the Fiscal Year 2022 Body-Worn Camera (BWC) Policy and Implementation Grant Program – Digital Evidence Management and Integration Demonstration Project 12-month no-cost extension.

After an opportunity for public comment was held, the Committee moved to approve the recommendations contained within the City Administrative Officer report, as detailed above.

Subsequently, on September 2, 2025, the Budget and Finance Committee also considered this matter and after providing an opportunity for public comment, the Budget and Finance Committee concurred with the recommendations made previously by the Public Safety Committee.

This matter is now forwarded to the Council for its consideration.
