Comments for Public Posting: As President & CEO of ONEgeneration, a nonprofit organization serving older adults, families, and caregivers throughout the San Fernando Valley, I am writing to express our strong support for Councilmember Padilla's motion to establish a temporary RV storage facility at the Metro parking lot off Balboa Blvd. ONEgeneration operates senior centers, home-delivered meal programs, and case management services that provide vital resources to some of our community's most vulnerable residents. Comments for Public Posting: I am a resident of Lake Balboa, and I am urging the City Council to take immediate action to address the growing issue of illegally parked RVs in our neighborhood. These encampments have created unsafe and unsanitary conditions for our families, especially our children who walk, bike, and play near these streets daily. The presence of these RVs has led to trash accumulation, late-night disturbances, and in some cases, open drug use and fires- all of which make our community feel unsafe. Many of us have reported these concerns repeatedly, only to be told that the City has nowhere to relocate these vehicles. This cycle has gone on far too long. The proposed temporary RV storage facility at Balboa and Victory is a critical step forward. It will finally allow the City to clear our streets, restore safety, and bring back the sense of peace our community deserves.
