Recommendation for Council action, as initiated by Resolution (Soto-Martinez,

INSTRUCT the Chief Legislative Analyst (CLA) to present a revised Resolution for this  
item in order to seek action in the 2025-2026 Federal Legislative Program, to be  
submitted for adoption in Council, and amend the existing language to SUPPORT or  
SPONSOR any legislation and/or administrative action to redesignate Temporary  
Protected Status for Nicaragua, Honduras, Haiti, and Venezuela.

completed a financial analysis of this report.

#### SUMMARY

At the meeting held on March 14, 2025, the Rules, Elections and Intergovernmental  
Relations Committee considered Resolution (Soto-Martinez, Hernandez – Price, et al.)  
relative to including in the City's 2023-24 Federal Legislative Program sponsorship or  
support for any legislation and/or administrative action to redesignate Temporary  
Protected Status for El Salvador, Nicaragua, and Honduras.

After an opportunity for public comment, the Committee moved to amend the  
recommendation stated in the CLA report and in the Resolution, as detailed above. This  
matter is now forwarded to the Council for its consideration.
