Summary:

The NoHo Neighborhood Council supports urgent changes to the Brown Act which would allow neighborhood councils the option to hold remote board and committee meetings. Neighborhood Council board members are all unpaid volunteers who often have obligations beyond their extensive volunteer duties. We have child and elder care obligations, work obligations, health concerns, and many other obligations in our daily lives. Access via telephonic meetings have allowed a wider variety of board members, stakeholders, and government officials to participate in our meetings and community. Neighborhood Councils desperately need options that allow them choices for remote and hybrid meetings that best suit the needs of their individual community.

This statement passed in a meeting held in accordance with the Brown Act on February 8, 2023 with a vote of 13 in favor and 1 opposed.
