The Echo Park Neighborhood Council (EPNC) Board of Governors supports the January 10, 2023 Resolution as co-presented by Councilmembers Bob Blumenfield of CD3 and Paul Krekorian of CD2.

The EPNC specifically appreciates the section of Resolution 23-0002-S17 stating:

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, with concurrence of the Mayor, that by adoption of this Resolution, the City of Los Angeles hereby includes in its 2023-2024 State Legislative Program SUPPORT for legislative action that would amend the Ralph M. Brown Act to allow local legal legislative bodies, including appointed boards, commissions, advisory bodies, and Neighborhood Councils, to continue to conduct most meetings virtually in the absence of any special circumstances, subject to appropriate safeguards to ensure full and robust opportunities for public participation, including by persons who lack means of digital access.

In addition to ensuring robust and equitable public participation, remote meetings are the best option for neighborhood councils to ensure the safety of their Board members and to utilize their funds for neighborhood concerns rather than IT purchases and maintenance.

RESOLUTION

On February 28, 2023, the EPNC Board of Governors held a Brown Act noticed-meeting, at 7pm through zoom. With a quorum of 12 board members present and vote count of 12 yeas, 0 nays, and 0 abstentions, the Board resolved to write a letter of support for the application as set forth above.
