A Neighborhood Council Community Impact Statement (CIS) has been successfully submitted to your Commission or City Council. We provided information below about CISs and attached a copy of the CIS.

We encourage you to reach out to the Community Impact Statement Filer to acknowledge receipt and if this Community Impact Statement will be scheduled at a future meeting. Neighborhood Council board members are volunteers and it would be helpful if they received confirmation that you received their CIS.

The CIS process was enabled by the Los Angeles Administrative Code §Section 22.819. It provides that, "a Neighborhood Council may take a formal position on a matter by way of a Community Impact Statement (CIS) or written resolution." NCs representatives also testify before City Boards and Commissions on the item related to their CIS. If the Neighborhood Council chooses to do so, the Neighborhood Council representative must provide the Commission with a copy of the CIS or resolution sufficiently in advance for review, possible inclusion on the agenda, and posting on the Commission's website. Any information you can provide related to your agenda setting schedule is helpful to share with the NC.

If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *listed on the Commission's agenda*, during the time the matter is heard, the designated Neighborhood Council representative should be given an opportunity to present the Neighborhood Council's formal position. We encourage becoming familiar with the City Council's rules on the subject. At the Chair's discretion, the Neighborhood Council representative may be asked to have a seat at the table (or equivalent for a virtual meeting) typically reserved for City staff and may provide the Neighborhood Council representative more time than allotted to members of the general public. They are also permitted up to five (5) minutes of time to address the legislative body. If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *not listed on the agenda*, the designated Neighborhood Council representative may speak during General Public Comments.

We share this information to assist you with the docketing neighborhood council items before your board/commission. If you have questions and/or concerns, please contact the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment at empowerla@lacity.org.

***Federal Immigration Enforcement / City Resources, Property, Personnel / Prohibit Use /
Compliance Monitoring Report***

November 20, 2024

The North Hollywood Northeast Neighborhood Council (NHNENC) strongly supports Council File 23-0243 and urges the City Council to prioritize this motion immediately, given the recent re-election of Donald Trump and his administration's renewed threats of mass deportations, the termination of birthright citizenship, and other policies that directly endanger our immigrant communities here in Los Angeles.

Los Angeles prides itself on being a sanctuary city, a place of cultural diversity and inclusion. However, this designation is meaningless without robust protections for those most vulnerable. During Trump's previous administration, we witnessed raids in schools, threats to Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA), and countless deportations that ripped families apart. The stakes are even higher now, with his rhetoric signaling the most aggressive immigration enforcement actions in history.


The motion, introduced on March 7, 2023, outlines critical protections against federal immigration enforcement within Los Angeles. These include barring the use of City resources, property, or personnel for immigration enforcement, safeguarding personal information, and ensuring compliance monitoring to prevent violations. However, it has been over a year and a half since this motion was introduced, and the necessary draft ordinance and compliance measures have yet to materialize.

This delay undermines the City's commitment to protecting immigrant communities and maintaining the public's trust. The NHNENC calls on the City Council to revive this file, direct the City Attorney to immediately draft the ordinance, and ensure that the Civil + Human Rights and Equity Department (CHRED) fulfills its mandate to monitor compliance and report on incidents.

Los Angeles must act decisively to demonstrate that our values are not just words but actions. We cannot allow Trump's policies to erode the safety and dignity of our residents. By passing and enforcing this ordinance, we reaffirm our commitment to being a sanctuary city that truly protects all who call Los Angeles home.
