A Neighborhood Council Community Impact Statement (CIS) has been successfully submitted to your Commission or City Council. We provided information below about CISs and attached a copy of the CIS.

We encourage you to reach out to the Community Impact Statement Filer to acknowledge receipt and if this Community Impact Statement will be scheduled at a future meeting. Neighborhood Council board members are volunteers and it would be helpful if they received confirmation that you received their CIS.

The CIS process was enabled by the Los Angeles Administrative Code §Section 22.819. It provides that, "a Neighborhood Council may take a formal position on a matter by way of a Community Impact Statement (CIS) or written resolution." NCs representatives also testify before City Boards and Commissions on the item related to their CIS. If the Neighborhood Council chooses to do so, the Neighborhood Council representative must provide the Commission with a copy of the CIS or resolution sufficiently in advance for review, possible inclusion on the agenda, and posting on the Commission's website. Any information you can provide related to your agenda setting schedule is helpful to share with the NC.

If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *listed on the Commission's agenda*, during the time the matter is heard, the designated Neighborhood Council representative should be given an opportunity to present the Neighborhood Council's formal position. We encourage becoming familiar with the City Council's rules on the subject. At the Chair's discretion, the Neighborhood Council representative may be asked to have a seat at the table (or equivalent for a virtual meeting) typically reserved for City staff and may provide the Neighborhood Council representative more time than allotted to members of the general public. They are also permitted up to five (5) minutes of time to address the legislative body. If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *not listed on the agenda*, the designated Neighborhood Council representative may speak during General Public Comments.


The Sun Valley Area Neighborhood Council, SVANC, in its regular meeting of July 13, 2023, passed the following Community Impact Statement by a vote of: 7 yes, 1 no, 2 absent, and 0 ineligible.

The Sun Valley Area Neighborhood Council, SVANC, supports Council File 23-0338 regarding the preparation to study the Sun Valley Metrolink Station to analyze its possible relocation and/or improvements of the current station.

Sun Valley is an area with limited resources and a population that is rapidly growing. A grand majority of its residents are considered essential workers who are in need of more and improved methods of public transportation. Given that most of Sun Valley is located in Council District 6, SVANC strongly recommends keeping the station within the Council District 6 boundaries.

SVANC would also recommend upgrading the Sun Valley Metrolink station with more signage on main streets directing the public to the Metrolink station. They strongly encourage better signage at the station, easy access to it, more lighting, parking safety, and affordable fares.
