The loss of these units has massive implications for my neighborhood, and for renters across the Westside. How will we ensure that renters in smaller buildings with similar habitability concerns do not face the same experience of being bought out of their units and forced to move not just out of their neighborhood, but out of the district entirely? This whole ordeal should be seen as a crossroads for the city, either we can agree to let giant developers buy candidates and get their way unimpeded, or we can start actually aggressively regulating corporate landlords and developers and advocating for tenants who are the majority of residents of this city.
