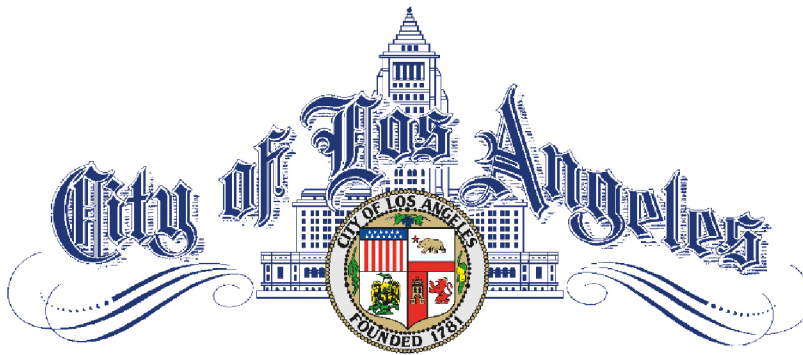

**REVISED DRAFT ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 80.73.1 OF DIVISION "N",
CHAPTER VIII OF THE LOS ANGELES MUNICIPAL CODE (LAMC) TO INCLUDE
RECREATIONAL VEHICLES AS VEHICLES THAT AN OPERATOR IS PROHIBITED
FROM RENTING, LEASING, OR SELLING IN THE PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY;
AND AMENDING LAMC SECTION 89.60 TO UPDATE THE FINES AND LATE
PENALTIES FOR ALL VIOLATIONS OF LAMC SECTION 80.73.1**

Honorable Members:

Pursuant to your request, this Office has prepared and now transmits for your consideration the enclosed revised draft ordinance, approved as to form and legality. The enclosed revised draft ordinance incorporates the amendments requested by the City Council on September 19, 2025.

The original draft ordinance (Report No. R25-0192) amends Section 80.73.1 of the Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) to expressly include recreational vehicles as one of the types of vehicles that an Operator, in conducting its business, is prohibited from renting, leasing, or selling in the public right-of-way. The revised draft ordinance incorporates the original amendments, but also amends LAMC Section 89.60 to update the fines and late penalties for all violations of LAMC Section 80.73.1 with an escalating

fine structure. In addition, the revised draft ordinance includes a provision that violations of Section 80.73.1 may be prosecuted as a misdemeanor. In cases where the City Attorney elects to criminally prosecute a violation, the defendant shall be subject to all applicable penalties authorized by LAMC Section 11.00(m), and not the civil penalties set forth in Section 80.73.1.

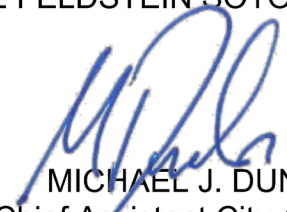
