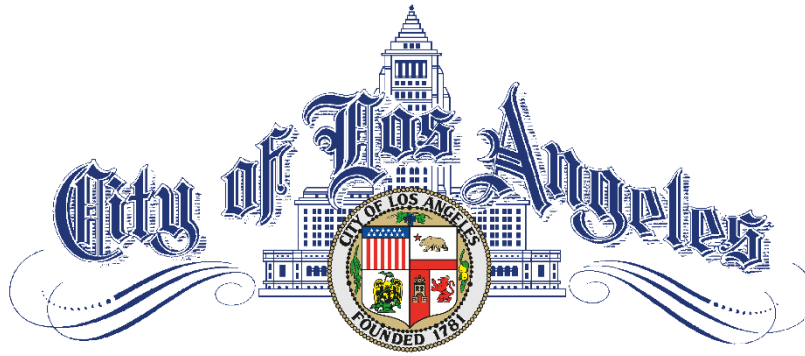

Honorable Members:

This report is intended to provide a status update on this Office's work in response to Council File No. 23-0600-S121 related to the Department of Transportation's (DOT) revised Vision Zero Evaluation and Safety Plan. Specifically, the City Council made two separate requests of this Office: to draft an ordinance amending the Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) to implement state law, and to report back with suggestions for additional legislation the City Council could adopt to ensure pedestrian safety.

With regard to the first request to draft an amendment to the LAMC, California State Assembly Bill 413 (the Daylighting to Save Lives Bill) bans vehicles from stopping, parking, or standing within 20 feet of the vehicle approach side of any marked or unmarked crosswalk or 15 feet of any crosswalk where a curb extension is present. Based on the new enforcement authority granted by state law and in anticipation of the City Council's interest in seeing DOT utilize that authority, this Office had already prepared and transmitted the requested ordinance, approved as to form and legality. That draft ordinance and a corresponding report are located in Council File No. 25-0661. The City Council may agendize the draft ordinance for consideration at any time

and a member of this Office will be available when you consider this matter to answer questions you may have

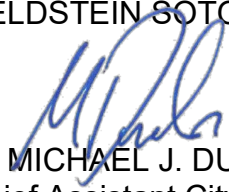
As to the second request, the City Attorney was asked to report back with ideas for possible ordinance(s) to ensure pedestrian safety based on the forthcoming findings from the California Highway Patrol (CHP) as directed in California State Assembly Bill 2147. Based on our understanding of the CHP's current schedule, the report is not expected to be released until 2028. This Office will be tracking the progress of the CHP report and will report back as requested as soon after the report's release as is practicable.
