Comments for Public Posting: I'm a resident of the Hollywood Knolls where I have lived for 37 years. I am writing to voice my objection to the proposed project of 68 units at Barham Boulevard & Floyd Terrace. The city has consistently overlooked any traffic adjustment, in our area to the expansion of Universal, Warner Brothers, NBC, St. Joe's Hospital and the inclusion of major new towers serving the studios -- which has already made traffic virtually impossible to penetrate without flooding the area with additional overwhelming grid-lock. The Knolls is a residential community of one family houses, not one of 68 unit complexes to further overwhelm what is already impossible to cope with. The location is unsuitable, thoughtless, and totally inappropriate for a unique and harmonious residential community. Please....re-think it!
