Comments for Public Posting: I support the 3rd Revision of ED 1 and request that additional guardrails be implemented through a 4th Revision to ensure no community in Los Angeles bears a disproportionate burden of ED 1 units and to promote geographic equity in the distribution of affordable housing citywide. I respectfully urge Mayor Bass and the Los Angeles City Council to: 1. Cap the number of ED 1 units to 500 per zip code (suggested) until all zip codes have contributed their fair share. 2. Implement a “Distance Rule” for ED 1 projects to promote equitable distribution of units within each zip code. ED 1 projects must be disallowed from clustering together in low-income enclaves for shelters and affordable housing projects. 3. Adopt an Airport Region Exemption from ED 1 projects and/or a moratorium on ED 1 projects within 5 miles of LAX until after the 2028 Olympics to avoid severe disruptions to airport operations and traffic mobility of visitors and local residents. 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
ED 1 Projects in Los Angeles Council District 11



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
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Planned ED 1 Units in CD11


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% of Population vs % of Planned ED 1 Units
