At its meeting held on June 29, 2023, the L.A. for Kids Steering Committee approved the recommendations of the attached Office of the City Administrative Officer report, which is hereby transmitted for Council consideration. Adoption of the report would reconfigure the composition of the Proposition K Regional Volunteer Neighborhood Oversight Committees (RVNOCs) to align with the Council District (CD) boundaries. These boundaries were adjusted after the 2020 decennial census: specifically, one representative from CD Four (4) from the Central Region to the Valley Region; and one representative from CD Five (5) from the Valley Region to the Central Region. All other CDs would remain unchanged.

There is no anticipated impact to the General Fund as this is an administrative action.

**SUBJECT: REVISIONS TO THE REGIONAL VOLUNTEER NEIGHBORHOOD
OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE STRUCTURE FOR THE PROPOSITION K - L.A. FOR KIDS
PROGRAM**

RECOMMENDATIONS

The L.A. for Kids Steering Committee recommend that the City Council:

1. Amend the current composition of the Regional Volunteer Neighborhood Oversight Committees (RVNOCs) to reflect the proposed composition as described in this report and as set forth in Attachment A;
2. Authorize the L.A. for Kids Steering Committee staff to make technical modifications as necessary to effectuate the intent of this report.

BACKGROUND:

On August 19, 1997, the City Council established three RVNOCs to advise the L.A. for Kids Steering Committee regarding when specified or competitive Proposition K projects should be undertaken (C.F. 97-0031-S2). These regional committees were established to represent the City's Valley, Central, and Southern regions so that committee members provided a regional perspective when advising on Proposition K funding priorities. The RVNOCs convene annually as part of the development of the Proposition K Five-year Plan. Each Council Office may appoint two representatives who live, operate a business, or own property within their Council District (CD).

On November 27, 2002, following the redistricting process that took place subsequent to the 2000 decennial census, the City Council amended the composition of the RVNOCs to reflect the then current CD boundaries (C.F. 02-0533-S3). Those boundaries have not been amended since and are as outlined below:

DISCUSSION

On December 7, 2021, following the 2020 decennial census, City Council adopted an Ordinance amending the metes and bounds of the CDs to reflect the recommendations of the Redistricting Commission and subsequent amendments (C.F. 20-0668-S7). The modification of the CD boundaries has made it so that the boundaries of CD Five (5) are wholly south of Mulholland Drive, making it impracticable for a member appointed by that Council Office to represent their interests in the Valley RVNOC.

Additionally, the boundaries of CD Four (4) have been modified so that the District encompasses both communities traditionally considered part of the Central RVNOC, such as Los Feliz and Hollywood, and communities traditionally considered part of the Valley RVNOC, such as Sherman Oaks and Tarzana. Therefore it is recommended that the composition of the RVNOCs be amended as set forth below and in Attachment A to this report to maintain equitable representation across regions. The proposed RVNOC composition modifies the previous composition by changing the RVNOC appointees of CDs Four (4) and Five (5) to different regions. No other changes are being proposed. The proposed RVNOC composition is as follows:

REVISIONS TO THE REGIONAL VOLUNTEER NEIGHBORHOOD OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE STRUCTURE FOR THE PROPOSITION K-L.A. FOR KIDS PROGRAM

SUMMARY

On August 19, 1997 the City Council established three Regional Volunteer Neighborhood Oversight Committees (RVNOC) to advise the L.A. for Kids Steering Committee regarding when specified or competitive Proposition K projects should be undertaken (CF 97-0031-S2). These regional committees were established to represent the City's Valley, Central, and Southern regions so that committee members provided a regional perspective when advising on Proposition K funding priorities. The RVNOCs convene annually as part of the development of the Proposition K 5-Year Plan. Each Council Office may appoint two representatives who live, operate a business, or own property within their Council District. The current RVNOC structure closely mirrors the former Council District boundaries with the following boundaries and membership:

Since the existing RVNOC structure was based on Council District boundaries prior to redistricting, the existing boundaries and membership must be modified to ensure consistency with the new Council District boundaries and maintain equitable representation across regions. The revisions are also necessary to ensure public participation. This report proposes amendments to the existing RVNOC structure as reflected in the following chart and illustrated in the attached map. Specifically, changes are recommended for Council Districts 4, 6, and 11.

The L.A. for Kids Steering Committee approved these changes at its meeting on October 31, 2002. Expedited consideration of this report is advised as the new boundaries must be adopted by Council, so that Council Offices can advise on their Proposition K-5 year plan priorities before the RVNOCs convene in January 2003.


