The scope of this project is massive, requiring many workers. With this comes responsibility of these workman regarding smoking safety. Again, the project's location is in a forest canyon adjacent to the Santa Monica Conservancy and presents many safety issues. Assessibility for fire and emergency vehicles is paramount. Project access plan. The ingress/egress to the project site is an impossible challenge. Woodhill Canyon, it's adjacent side streets Viewcrest and Vantage are all undeveloped streets with parking on one or both sides creating a one lane scenario for these large trucks to try and navigate. There is no way any trucks can wait in the area without impeding local traffic with no turnarounds nearby. The workman's vehicles are another issue; will there be on-site parking for all of them? A massive project such as this requires an incredible amount a sensitive pre-planning and some of these things (especially insurances) are going to be extremely difficult, if not impossible to procure.
