A Neighborhood Council Community Impact Statement (CIS) has been successfully submitted to your Commission or City Council. We provided information below about CISs and attached a copy of the CIS.

We encourage you to reach out to the Community Impact Statement Filer to acknowledge receipt and if this Community Impact Statement will be scheduled at a future meeting. Neighborhood Council board members are volunteers and it would be helpful if they received confirmation that you received their CIS.

The CIS process was enabled by the Los Angeles Administrative Code §Section 22.819. It provides that, "a Neighborhood Council may take a formal position on a matter by way of a Community Impact Statement (CIS) or written resolution." NCs representatives also testify before City Boards and Commissions on the item related to their CIS. If the Neighborhood Council chooses to do so, the Neighborhood Council representative must provide the Commission with a copy of the CIS or resolution sufficiently in advance for review, possible inclusion on the agenda, and posting on the Commission's website. Any information you can provide related to your agenda setting schedule is helpful to share with the NC.

If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *listed on the Commission's agenda*, during the time the matter is heard, the designated Neighborhood Council representative should be given an opportunity to present the Neighborhood Council's formal position. We encourage becoming familiar with the City Council's rules on the subject. At the Chair's discretion, the Neighborhood Council representative may be asked to have a seat at the table (or equivalent for a virtual meeting) typically reserved for City staff and may provide the Neighborhood Council representative more time than allotted to members of the general public. They are also permitted up to five (5) minutes of time to address the legislative body. If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *not listed on the agenda*, the designated Neighborhood Council representative may speak during General Public Comments.

Summary: I, Mihran Kalaydjian, declare that I am the President of the Winnetka Neighborhood Council (NC) and that on December 12, 2023, at a Brown Act noticed public meeting was held by Winnetka Neighborhood Council with a quorum of 11 board members present and that by a vote of 0 yes, 11 no, and 0 abstentions adopted the following resolution: The Winnetka NC is not in support of SB 411 bill. The Winnetka Neighborhood Council immediately request that the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment, and the office of the City Attorney strongly support an interpretation of SB411 whereby the vote by the "eligible legislative body" is clarified to mean human bodies in attendance and not empty seats. The Winnetka Neighborhood Council is asking from Department of Neighborhood Empowerment (DONE) address ASAP the issue of how NCs will meet the SB411 requirement to ATTEMPT to secure a physical location with computer

and internet connections for the public to access online meetings after hours, including opening the DONE City Hall, LA and/or Van Nuys offices after hours, on request, and use their power under the LAMC Plan for NCs to declare that these offices will be adequate to meet the Los Angeles or Valley NC requirements under SB411. SB411 already mandates city council offices fill this purpose during their working hours (an unfunded mandate, which the legislature ignored). The objective of an after hours solution, like opening the DONE offices upon 3 working day advance request, is only to be able to say the online meeting can continue without a Brown Act problem.
