The Rent Stabilization Ordinance is an incredibly important law that helps keep millions of Angelenos stably housed. But the rent increases allowed right now are too high and unaffordable for Angelenos who are already struggling to make the rent. The city and wealthy real estate developers and corporate landlords have created a housing crisis. Every day I see more people living on the streets when housing is a human right! We need to be doing more to keep people in their current homes. I urge the City Council to adopt the Keep LA Housed demands for the RSO formula to: Cap increases at 60% CPI or 3% with no minimum increase Get rid of unfair additional increases for utilities and extra occupants. Every extra percentage point is less money for tenants to spend on other necessities like food, medical care, transportation, and childcare. We need the formula updated immediately—new rent increases go into effect in July and we can't afford any more increases under the current formula. The City Council must vote now to update the RSO with a new formula to keep Angelenos housed. Thank you!
