The CIS process was enabled by the to Los Angeles Administrative Code §Section 22.819. It provides that, "a Neighborhood Council may take a formal position on a matter by way of a Community Impact Statement (CIS) or written resolution." NCs representatives also testify before City Boards and Commissions on the item related to their CIS. If the Neighborhood Council chooses to do so, the Neighborhood Council representative must provide the Commission with a copy of the CIS or rResolution sufficiently in advance for review, possible inclusion on the agenda, and posting on the Commission's website. Any information you can provide related to your agenda setting schedule is helpful to share with the NC.

If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *listed on the Commission's agenda*, during the time the matter is heard, the designated Neighborhood Council representative should be given an opportunity to present the Neighborhood Council's formal position. We encourage becoming familiar with the City Council's rules on the subject. At the Chair's discretion, the Neighborhood Council representative may be asked to have a seat at the table (or equivalent for a virtual meeting) typically reserved for City staff and may provide the Neighborhood Council representative more time than allotted to members of the general public. They are also permitted up to five (5) minutes of time to address the legislative body. If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *not listed on the agenda*, the designated Neighborhood Council representative may speak during General Public Comments.

Title: Economic Roundtable / Economic Study / Annual Rent Increase / Rent Stabilization Ordinance (RSO) / Sole-Source Contract

Position: SUPPORT IF AMENDED

Summary: On April 9, 2025, at a Brown Act Compliant Meeting, NoHo Neighborhood Council voted to support Council File 23-1134 if it is amended.

The NoHo Neighborhood Council strongly supports (if amended) Council File CF-25-1134 and the need for reform of our Rent Stabilization Ordinance. We strongly support the Keep LA Housed Coalition’s recommendation of a formula that:

- Sets the annual allowable rent increase at 60% of the change in the Consumer Price Index or 3%, whichever is lower and a 0% rent increase floor. (“3%/60% CPI ceiling and 0% floor formula”)
- No utility increases
- No additional occupant increases.
- No rent banking.
- No increase for additional occupants.

Los Angeles is a city of renters and should have the strongest RSO in the state. We strongly urge the City Council to adopt Keep LA Housed’s proposed formula.
