Comments for Public Posting: An appropriate metaphor to describe advocating for switching from using gas powered leaf blowers to electric leaf blowers is similar to one trying to decide between drinking acetone or paint thinner. First: Electric leaf blowers rely on power. Los Angeles' electrical grid is powered by multiple gas and coal plants. "Going electric" is highly misunderstood and warrants some additional consideration. Second: Any type of blower lifts up particulate matter causing it to travel in the air causing problems for people and animals. Third: No other city works so hard to blow its leaves and thereby impacting the organisms and soil nutrition. Leaves are food for soil. So long as they are "managed" not rising to the level of a hazard, they are supposed to fall on the ground and get put back for recycling into the soil. Fourth: No one from the city has consulted any outside party to better understand how the pollution from blowing dust, fungus, particulate matter and other toxins into the public's right of way, AND onto the personal property of your constituents affects us.
