**Comments for Public Posting:** Hello. My name is Tony and I am opposing the motion to integrate existing surveillance camera networks into LAPD's Real Time Crime Centers. 1. It is a violation of privacy and may be challenged in the court of law. 2. Surveillance cameras pose serious threats of data breaching with unauthorized agencies including ICE, and Federal Agencies. 3. The City of LA is sanctuary city which limits cooperation with federal immigration authorities. This means the city's resources and personnel are prohibited from being used to assist federal immigration enforcement efforts. 4.
