adequate metrics to ensure all stakeholder concerns are considered and addressed in and in transition to the new system Per Los Angeles City Charter, Section 910, the RVNC PSHT Committee has collected data to monitor the delivery of permits, covenants, and entitlements for low-income units. In May 2023, LAHD collaborated with us in confirming the covenant information (by matching an LAHD covenant file with an LADBS permit file for the same project) for 78 out of 80 projects with Transit Oriented Communities (TOC) or Density Bonus incentives for which LADBS had issued final permits or certificates of occupancy. Those 80 projects were part of a larger list of projects with permit applications and either TOC or Density Bonus incentives, in which the status of the covenants could not be determined for 40 percent of the projects.

Comment in Support of Council's decision to add an additional \$6.5 million from general funds to cover the expected VOCA cuts:

Dear City Council,

I am writing to appreciate the Budget & Finance Committee and Councilmember Yarovslavsky in particular for their decision to allocate and additional \$6.5 million to help fill the gap left from expected Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) funding cuts.

Nationwide VOCA funding cuts are poised to have devastating effects on survivors and service providers. The Council's proactive approach in addressing this gap will significantly support survivors in Los Angeles.

VOCA cuts impact domestic violence and rape survivors at every step of their recovery. In California, 400 agencies, including rape crisis centers, domestic violence non-shelter programs, and legal services, will face cuts of up to 45%. These programs serve the communities most in need of these nonprofit services. In Los Angeles County alone, 40-50 agencies will be affected.

It is critical to include funding for non-shelter domestic violence programs and sexual assault centers in funding. Without services from rape crisis centers, victim survivors and their families will be left without recourse--crisis support, healing modalities, and legal services are being gutted. Peace Over Violence has already had to lay off 3 members of our legal staff, heavily impacting our ability to help survivors legally protect themselves and their children. Non-shelter domestic violence programs serve a huge amount of survivors and are part of our domestic violence response network in LA county. We've spent 50 years building a network that is set to be dismantled this summer. Gender-based violence programming and policy must include all survivors of abuse, including those affected by stalking, trafficking, sexual harassment, and sexual violence in all its forms, including rape. This includes services to including children, teens, adults, and seniors, trans people and people of all ages and genders. Thank you for your support of this measure; hopefully other local funding remedies can be instituted to mitigate this pending crisis.
